MATCH FACTS:

- **Kvitova** has won her last 3 meetings with **Azarenka**. **Azarenka's** last victory vs. Kvitova dates back to 2009 Australian Open
- **Kvitova** will earn \$1,750,000 if she wins and \$890,000 if she finishes runner-up; **Azarenka** will earn \$1,635,000 if she wins and \$775,000 if she is runner-up. (Each win in round robin stage is worth \$115,000)

KVITOVA QUICK HITS:

- **Kvitova** is the first Czech to reach the final at the WTA Championships since Novotna won the title in 1997, and the 5th overall (Navratilova, Sukova, Mandlikova, Novotna) and is bidding to be the 3rd Czech player to win the WTA Championships title after Navratilova in 1978-79 and Novotna in 1997
- **Kvitova** is projected to rise to a career-high of No.2 unless Azarenka wins the title; she would become just the 3rd Czech woman to rank in Top 2 (after Navratilova, Novotna). **Kvitova** finished 2010 ranked No.34
- **Kvitova** is bidding to win her 6th title of the year and tie Wozniacki atop the 2011 singles titles leaderboard. Her 5 titles so far have come at : Brisbane, Paris [Indoors], Madrid, Wimbledon and Linz

- **Kvitova** is 18-0 at hard/indoor tournaments this year, including her 4 matches here; in all WTA main draw matches in 2011 she has an 82.8% win-loss percentage, second only to Serena Williams (88%)
- **Kvitova** has hit 21 aces in her 4 matches so far, pushing her into 3rd place for the season with 238 behind Gajdosova (260) and Bartoli (258)
- **Kvitova** came back from a set down to win her SF, the 9th time that she has done so this year; she is 1 of 5 players to have won from a set down 9 times this year (Kuznetsova, Sharapova, Zvonareva, Peng)
- On Thursday, **Kvitova** scored her 2nd win vs. a reigning world No.1 (d. Wozniacki), having also defeated Safina at 2009 US Open); she is 12-5 vs. Top 10 players this year and 6-2 vs. Top 5
- **Kvitova** is 1 of 5 lefties in the Top 50 (Safarova, Kerber, Martinez Sanchez, Pervak) and 1 of 6 Czechs; next weekend she will lead Czech Republic in its first Fed Cup final (vs. Russia at Moscow) in more than 20 years

AZARENKA QUICK HITS:

- **Azarenka** is making her 3rd consecutive appearance at Championship and has advanced past the round-robin stage for the first time
- **Azarenka** is the first Belarusian to reach the WTA Championships singles final; she is the 2nd player to represent Belarus here after Zvereva, who played 6 times (1988, 1990, 1993-95, 1998), reaching SF in 1995
- **Azarenka** is projected to return to her career-high ranking of No.3 by reaching the final and will rise to a career-high No.2 if she wins the title; she has been ranked in the Top 5 since the week of April 11, 2011
- **Azarenka** is bidding to become the 3rd player to win 4 or more titles in 2011 (after Kvitova and Wozniacki). Last Sunday, she won her 3rd singles title of 2011 at Luxembourg; she also won back-to-back titles at Miami and Marbella earlier in the year; she has 8 WTA singles titles to date
- **Azarenka** is 3-2 vs. Top 5 players this year
- **Azarenka** jointly owns the season's longest winning streak at 12 matches (Won Miami and Marbella, won 1 match at Fed Cup) with Clijsters and Serena Williams
- **Azarenka** reached her first-ever Grand Slam SF at 2011 Wimbledon (l. Kvitova)

TOURNAMENT HISTORY: Making Championships debut, the first player from Czech Republic to compete in singles at the event since 1998 (Novotna)

2011 SUMMARY: WON (5): Brisbane, Paris [Indoors], Madrid, Wimbledon, Linz; **R-Up (1):** Eastbourne; **SF (1):** Tokyo; **QF (1):** Australian Open; **4r (1):** Roland Garros

- Won **first Grand Slam title** at **Wimbledon** (as No.8 seed, d. No.4 seed Azarenka in SF, d. No.5 Sharapova in F); became 3rd Czech and 3rd left-hander to win Wimbledon; youngest Grand Slam champion since Ivanovic (2008 Roland Garros)
- Also won titles at **Brisbane** (d. Petkovic in F), **Paris [Indoors]** (d. top seed Clijsters), **Madrid**, defeating 3 of world's Top 6 en route (No.3 Zvonareva, No.6 Li and No.5 Azarenka in final) and **Linz** (as top seed, d. Cibulkova in final)
- Cracked Top 10 after Madrid on May 9 and became the first woman from Czech Republic to reach Top 5 the week of October 3; became the 5th Czech woman to reach Top 5 (atfer Navratilova, Mandlikova, Sukova, Novotna)
- Won titles on 4 different surfaces in 2011 - Brisbane (hard/outdoor), Madrid (clay), Wimbledon (grass) and Paris [Indoors] and Linz (hard/indoor)
- **R-Up** at **Eastbourne** (l. Bartoli; both finalists played SF and F in same day); **SF** at **Tokyo** (l. Zvonareva, led 5-1 in first set; clinched qualification for TEB BNP Paribas WTA Championships-Istanbul 2011 at Tokyo; also made top 5 debut
- Advanced to **QF** at **Australian Open** (d. No.5 seed Stosur in 3r, l. No.2 Zvonareva); broke Top 20 afterwards; and **4r** at **Roland Garros** (l. eventual champion Li)
- **3r** (after 1r bye) at **Miami** (as No.12 seed, l. Pavlyuchenkova), **Toronto** and **Cincinnati** (l. Petkovic at both)
- Lost opening matches after 1r bye at **Indian Wells** (l. Zahlavova Strycova) and **Dubai** (l. qualifier Morita); fell **1r** at **US Open** (l. Dulgheru) and **Beijing** (l. Arvidsson)
- Went 4-0 in **Fed Cup** to lead Czech Republic to final for first time since 1988
- Withdrew from **Doha** w/abdominal injury, **Stuttgart** w/lower back injury, **Brussels** w/hip injury and **Bad Gastein** and **Carlsbad** w/adductor injury
- Played in 2 ITF events: Nassau (March, l. Barrois in opening match) and Prague (May, R-Up l. Rybarikova)

- Won first **Grand Slam title** at 2011 Wimbledon; has now won 4 titles in 2011
- After finishing 2010 ranked No.34 had a hear of breakthroughs in 2011; broke **Top 20** on January 31, 2011; **Top 10** on 9 May 2011; made **Top 5** debut on October 3, 2011; became the 5th Czech woman to reach Top 5 (atfer Navratilova, Mandlikova, Sukova, Novotna)
- Has 8 **career Top 5 wins**, most recently against No.2 Sharapova, by ret, (2011 Tokyo), also No.1 Safina (2009 US Open), No.3 Wozniacki (2010 Wimbledon), No.2 Clijsters (2011 Paris [Indoors]), No.3 Zvonareva and No.5 Azarenka (both 2011 Madrid), No.5 Azarenka (2011 Wimbledon)

- Reached first GS SF at 2010 Wimbledon, having never previously won a match on grass (unseeded, l. eventual champion and top seed S.Williams)

- Grand Slam **mixed doubles champion** at 2007 US Open (w/ Mirnyi) and 2008 Roland Garros (w/B.Bryan); **doubles runner-up** at 2008 Australian Open (w/Peer), 2009 Roland Garros (w/Vesnina) and 2011 Australian Open (w/Kirilenko)

PESCHKE/SREBOTNIK

- **Peschke/Srebotnik** have reached the doubles final at the WTA Championships for the 2nd successive year; last year in Doha, they lost to Dulko/Pennetta 75 64 in the final
- While this is their second Championships appearance as a team, both **Peschke** and **Srebotnik** previously played at the Championships with other partners. **Peschke** qualified with Schiavone in 2006 (SF) and with Stubbs in both 2007 (SF) and 2008 (runner-up). **Srebotnik** is playing her 6th WTA Championships overall; she was runner-up in 2007 and SF in 2008 (w/Sugiyama) and was also a quarterfinalist in 2001-02 (w/Krizan)
- **Peschke** is bidding to become the 5th Czech to win the Championships doubles title (Navratilova, Mandlikova, Sukova, Novotna), while **Srebotnik** would become the first Slovenian to win at the Championships in either singles or doubles
- **Peschke/Srebotnik** are the leading doubles team of 2011, capturing 6 titles (Auckland, Doha, Eastbourne, Wimbledon, Carlsbad and Beijing) and finishing runner-up at Sydney, Dubai and Madrid
- After winning their first Grand Slam doubles title at 2011 Wimbledon, **Peschke/Srebotnik** jointly assumed the No.1 doubles ranking, holding on to the top spot for 10 weeks
- **Peschke/Srebotnik** have won a total of 8 doubles titles as a team. In total, **Srebotnik** has won 29 doubles titles and Peschke 22; **Srebotnik** also owns 5 Grand Slam mixed doubles titles
- Both **Peschke** and **Srebotnik** are both former Top 30 singles players, **Peschke** has not played singles since 2007 Roland Garros, while **Srebotnik** started to concentrate solely on doubles from the middle of 2010

HUBER/RAYMOND

- **Huber** and **Raymond** are both through to their 4th WTA Championships doubles final but their first as a team. **Huber** won the title in 2007-08 and was runner-up in 2009 (all w/Black, while **Raymond** won all three of her previous finals at this event (2001 w/Stubbs, 2005-06 w/Stosur)
- **Huber** is making her 5th Championships appearance, while **Raymond** is making her 11th

ABOUT THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

- This is the 41st staging of the event (began in 1972). The Championships will be hosted in Istanbul the next 3 years (2011-13) after being staged in Doha, Qatar from 2008-10. Eight (8) different cities have hosted the event
- The singles event features 8 players and begins as a round robin event, with 4 players in the Red Pool and 4 in the White Pool. Over the first 4 days of competition, each player meets the other 3 players in her group, with the top 2 in each pool moving on to the semifinals. Each of the group winners meets the runner-up in the other group in the semifinals. The winners of each semifinal meet in the championship match
- In 2003, this round robin format feeding into a 4-woman single elimination draw was held in singles for the first time since 1982
- The doubles event at the TEB BNP Paribas WTA Championships features 4 teams in a single elimination draw - Kveta Peschke (CZE)/Katarina Srebotnik (SLO), Liezel Huber (USA)/Lisa Raymond (USA), Vania King (USA)/Yaroslava Shvedova (KAZ) and defending champions Gisela Dulko (ARG)/Flavia Pennetta (ITA).

MORE ABOUT CHAMPIONSHIPS

- For the 2nd consecutive year, 7 different countries are represented among the 8 qualifiers; including the 2 alternates there are 9 different countries represented
- In 2004, over half the field was from one nation (Russia - 5 of 8) for the first time since March 1986 (9 Americans of 16 players)
- For the 2nd consecutive year (3rd all-time) no Americans are in the draw (also 2006, when no player qualified)
- Six (6) players have advanced to the final on their Championships debut; only Serena Williams (2001) and Maria Sharapova (2004) won the title on their debut; Tracy Austin (1979 R-Up), Andrea Jaeger (1981 R-Up), Lindsay Davenport (1994 R-Up) and Martina Hingis (1996 R-Up)
- Petra Kvitova and Li Na are both making their Championships debut this year; Agnieszka Radwanska has previously played this event as an alternate but has also qualified as of right for the first time
- The longest Championships win streak was compiled by Martina Navratilova, who won 21 straight matches in winning 5 titles between 1983 and 1986 and reaching the quarterfinals in 1987; the second-longest win streaks in tournament history went to Chris Evert and Monica Seles, who each won 12 matches in a row
- Between 1984 and 1998, a best-of-five sets final was used to decide the Championships final; three finals went the distance: 1990 - Seles vs. Sabatini (the first woman's match in 89 years to extend to five sets since the 1901 Philadelphia Championships); 1995 - Graf vs. A.Huber; 1996 - Graf vs. Hingis. Six finals went to four sets (1986 - March, 1987, 1989, 1991, 1993 and 1998)
- On 20 occasions finalists at the Championships have reached the final without the loss of a set; the most recent player to do so was Justine Henin in 2007 (she would win the final in three sets)
- Eight (8) times a Championships winner has not dropped a set en route to the title; Chris Evert achieved the feat three times (1972, 73, 75) and Martina Navratilova did it twice (1984, 85); Gabriela Sabatini did not drop a set in 1988, while Serena Williams and Kim Clijsters did the same in 2001 and 2002 respectively
- There have been 17 different winners in 40 stagings; of those 17 winners, 14 have been former world No.1's, only exceptions were Hanika (1982), Sabatini (1988, 1994) and Novotna (1997)
- Players from 10 different nations have won: USA (15), GER (6), BEL (5), CZE (3), YUG (3), ARG (2), AUS (2), SUI (2), FRA (1) & RUS (1)

ROUND ROBIN TIE-BREAKING METHODS

Since 2003 when Championships began its current format, a semifinalist has been decided by the tie-break method 3 times (2003, 2004, 2009). The final standings of each group shall be determined by the following:

- 1) Greatest number of wins
- 2) Greatest number of matches played; or
- 3) Head-to-head results if only two (2) players are tied, or if three (3) players are tied then:
 - a. If three (3) players each have the same number of wins, a player having played less than all three (3) matches is automatically eliminated and the player advancing to the single elimination competition is the winner of the match-up of the two remaining tied players; or
 - b. Highest percentage of sets won; or
 - c. Highest percentage of games won

ABOUT THE 2011 CHAMPIONSHIPS FIELD (not including alternates)

- The average age of the qualifiers is 24 years, 6 months; Li is the oldest (29 years, 8 months) and Wozniacki is the youngest (21 years, 3 months)
- Four (4) of last year's Championships field return – Azarenka (1-2 in RR), Stosur (SF), Wozniacki (R-Up) and Zvonareva (SF); Li was an alternate last year but was not called in to action
- The singles field includes 4 Grand Slam champions, including the last 3 Slams in 2011 - Li (2011 Roland Garros), Kvitova (2011 Wimbledon) and Stosur (2011 US Open) - and Sharapova (2004 Wimbledon, 2006 US Open, 2008 Australian Open)
- Another 2 qualifiers have reached a Grand Slam final Wozniacki (2009 US Open) and Zvonareva (2010 Wimbledon, 2010 US Open)

CHAMPIONSHIPS PARTICIPANTS BY NATION

- AUSTRALIA: In 2010 Stosur became the first Australian since Mandlikova in 1989 and first Aussie-born since Turnbull in 1985 to participate in singles at Championships
- BELARUS: Making her 3rd consecutive appearance (2009-11), Azarenka is the 2nd player to represent Belarus at the Championships; Natasha Zvereva reached the Championships 6 times (1988, 1990, 1993-95, 1998) highlighted by a SF result in 1995
- CHINA: Li is the first Chinese player to participate in singles at Championships; she was an alternate last year in Doha, but did not play a match
- CZECH REPUBLIC: Kvitova is the first player from the Czech Republic to compete in singles at the Championships since 1998 (Novotna)

- RUSSIA: This is the 10th consecutive year that 2 or more Russians have qualified for Championships; 10 different Russians have competed in singles at the year-end Championships; Sharapova (2004-07, 2011) and Zvonareva (2004, 2008-11) will each be making their 5th career appearance at the event; among the Russians to participate at Championships, Dementieva (10) has made the most appearances, followed by Kuznetsova, Sharapova and Zvonareva with 5 appearances each

Liezel Huber regained the doubles No.1 ranking after she teamed with Lisa Raymond to win the 2011 US Open title. Huber can secure the year-end doubles No.1 ranking for the 4th time in her career (also 2007-09) by playing (win or lose) her SF match at Championships. She enters Championships with 154 weeks at No.1; the first week of the 2012 season (January 2, 2012) would be her 164th career week at No.1 moving her into 2nd place on the all-time list, passing former doubles partner Cara Black (163 weeks). Martina Navratilova holds the all-time record for weeks at No.1 (237 weeks).
